# ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN KIRTLAND COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND CENTRAL MICHIGAN UNIVERSITY BOARD OF TRUSTEES

# STATEMENT OF COOPERATION

Kirtland Community College (KCC) and Central Michigan University Board of Trustees (CMU) wish to facilitate the transfer of students who complete an associate's degree at KCC to a bachelor's degree program at CMU. This Agreement is intended to clarify the terms and conditions of transfer for students.

## **AGREEMENT**

Kirtland Community College and Central Michigan University Board of Trustees, hereby agree as follows:

- A person who has earned an Associate of Applied Science in Nursing from KCC and has achieved the minimum requirements specified by CMU may transfer all credits earned at KCC as listed on the associated Transfer Credit Guide to CMU. Minimum requirements are as follows:
  - a) C or higher, 2.0 on a 4.0 scale for competency courses
  - b) C or higher, 2.0 on a 4.0 scale for all nursing major courses
  - c) C+ or higher, 2.5 on a 4.0 scale Admission GPA, and
  - d) Active, unencumbered registered nurse (RN) license.
- 2. A person who has earned an Associate of Applied Science in Nursing from KCC and has followed the associated Transfer Credit Guide may transfer all credits specified on the Transfer Credit Guide towards the Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree at CMU without duplicative study. To complete requirements for graduation from CMU, students who follow the attached Transfer Credit Guide must also:
  - a) Complete a minimum of 30 academic hours at CMU.
  - b) Complete a minimum of 120 academic hours between KCC and CMU.
  - c) Complete the remaining program requirements, distribution requirements and other major and degree requirements listed in the CMU Undergraduate bulletin.
- KCC and CMU agree to cooperate by communicating with each other and with their common and respective publics concerning this established relationship.
- 4. To the extent permitted by the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), KCC and CMU agree to share data on student achievement for purposes of assessing program effectiveness. Any exchange by the parties of

student record information protected by the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (20 USC § 1232g) and implementing regulations (34 CFR Part 99) ("FERPA") shall occur only in full compliance with FERPA, including, without limitation, committing the receiving party to limit the use of such information to the purposes for which the disclosure was made, and to impose such limits on any re-disclosure, and the parties agree to comply with all applicable statutory and regulatory provisions, including, without limitation 34 CFR 99.31, 99.32, 99.33, 99.34 and 99.35.

- 5. KCC and CMU agree to communicate any curriculum changes or policies, which affect the agreed-upon relationship, as soon as it is reasonably possible. Both parties reserve the right to amend or revise this agreement. These changes must be submitted in writing and signed by both parties.
- 6. KCC and CMU further agree to communicate concerning the development of plans that might lead to future opportunities for cooperation between the two institutions. Responsibility for communication related to the agreement will be given to the Nursing Program Director or his/her designee, CMU and the Director of Nursing and his/her designee at Kirtland Community College.
- 7. To the extent permitted by Michigan law, KCC and CMU agree to indemnify and hold one another harmless from any and all claims initiated by student participants, their parents, survivors, or agents, arising from any negligent acts or omission on the part of either institution or any of their employees.
- 8. This agreement terminates February 28, 2027 or five (5) years from the date fully executed, whichever is later; however, either party may terminate this agreement upon 90 days' written notice to the other party.
- 9. All notices and other communications under this Agreement must be in writing and will be deemed given (a) when delivered personally, (b) on the fourth business day after being mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested, or (c) the next business day after delivery to a recognized overnight courier at the following addresses (or to such other address as either party may have specified by notice given to the other party pursuant to this provision):



### Admission Requirements, Retention & Termination Standards

To be considered for admission, a student must meet the following criteria:

- · A completed program application
- An active, unencumbered RN license
- · An admission GPA of 2.5 or higher

Application Submission Deadline: The University admits students into this program twice a year in the spring and fall semesters. Students may apply to the program at any time during the last semester of the Associate degree or diploma program or after completing the program.

Note: A student may to apply to the program, receive provisional admission and take up to 12 credits while preparing for the NCLEX- RN examination.

Once admitted into the program, students must:

- Maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher.
- · Maintain an active, unencumbered RN license in your state.

If a student does not continue to meet retention standards, s/he may be asked to withdraw from the program. The nursing faculty maintains the right to terminate a student from the program if s/he is not progressing satisfactorily.

Practical Experience: American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN) BSN essentials require all RN to BSN programs to include practice experience into the program. This experiential learning strategies, or practice experience is incorporated into several courses throughout the program. You will be able to complete this experiential learning at your workplace or in your community. Students can identify their own practice experience with faculty approval.

#### General Notes

- A grade of C or better is required for a course to transfer.
- A bachelor's degree at CMU requires a minimum of 120 semester hours of credit. Some majors or degrees will require more.
- A minimum of 30 semester hours of credit must be earned from CMU.
- A minimum of 40 hours must be completed at the 300 level or above. Upon successful completion of all requirements of the major, 10 of the 45 credit
  hours awarded for an active unencumbered RN license will be equivalent to the CMU 300 level.
- . The University Program Requirements and competencies, other than WI competencies, may be fulfilled by students who satisfy the MTA
- Students are required to meet the following CMU Competency Requirements with a "C" or above: two Written English (composition) courses, one Oral
  English (communication) course, one Mathematics course designated by CMU as a competency course, one Quantitative Reasoning Course, and 12
  credits in Writing Intensive Coursework. Students who satisfy MTA are exempted from six credits of Writing Intensive. The remaining six credits must
  be completed at CMU.

Any remaining required and elective courses for a bachelor's degree will be selected in consultation with an academic advisor to ensure that CMU degree requirements are being met.
