1. At a meeting held on July 14, 1965, the State Board of Education approved the formation of a community college district to be composed of the entire territory of C. O. O. R. Intermediate School District, and also approved an annual maximum tax rate for the proposed community college district of one (1) mill (\$1.00 per \$1,000), all in accordance with the provisions of Section 10 b of Act 188, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, as amended, and

This is to notify you that the Board of Education of C. O. O. R. Intermediate School District has received approval from the State Board of Education to form a community college district comprising all of the territory of C. O. O. R. Intermediate School District. This Board of Education has further designated that an election be held in all of the school districts comprising the territory to be included in the proposed community college district on Monday, March 7, 1966, all of which is authorized by Act 188, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, as amended.

You are further advised that the following questions shall be submitted to the electors of each affected school district at said election to be held on Monday, March 7, 1966, in substantially the following form:

- I. Shall Act No. 188 of the Public Acts of 1955, as amended, being sections 390.871 to 390.383 of the Compiled Laws of 1948, be adopted and be effective in a community college district comprised of C. O. O. R. Intermediate School District?
- II. Shall the Board of Trustees of the proposed community college district comprised of C. O. O. R. Intermediate School District be authorized to levy a tax on the real and tangible personal property within the district not to exceed the annual rate of one mill on each dollar (\$1.00 on each \$1,000) of the assessed valuation, as equalized, of the property within the district, in the manner and for the purposes provided by Act 188 of 1955, as amended?

In addition to the above questions, there will be a vote on candidates for office of community college district trustees for the proposed community college district. The statute provides for six (6) trustees to be elected at large from the territory included in the community college district. Nomination petitions for the first board of trustees must be filed with the Secretary of the C. O. O. R. Intermediate School District not later than 4:00 o'clock, p. m. , on Monday, February 7, 1966. Nomination petitions may be obtained from this office.

Section 10 b of Act 188, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, as amended, provides in part as follows:

"The board of education in each local school district shall provide the necessary ballots and shall conduct the balloting on the question of coming under the provisions of this act and on the election of the first board of trustees. In those instances where part of a local school district is in another community college district, votes on this question shall be taken only in the remainder of the district. This act shall be effective only in the territory where balloting on the question shall have been ordered."

The forms of the ballots and the names of persons nominated for the board of trustees, as these are to be printed by each school district, will be furnished by this office at a later date.
