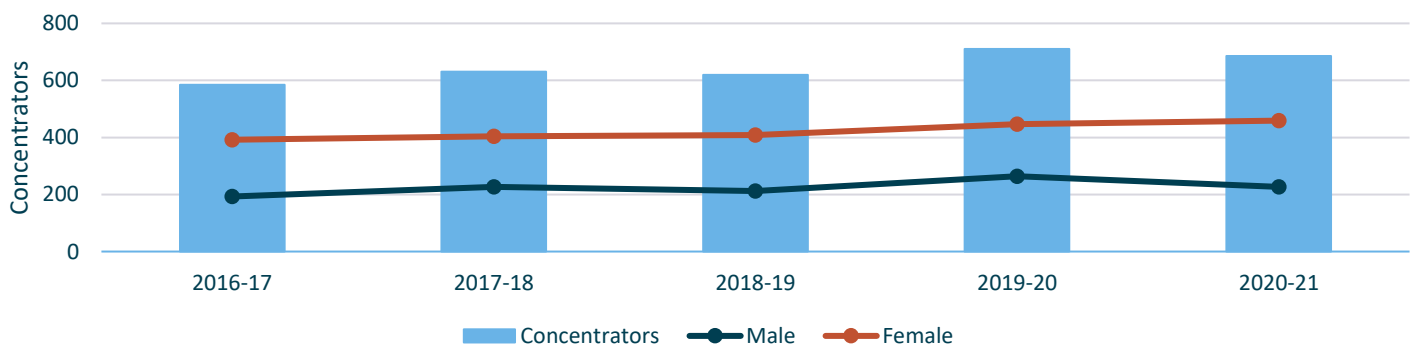

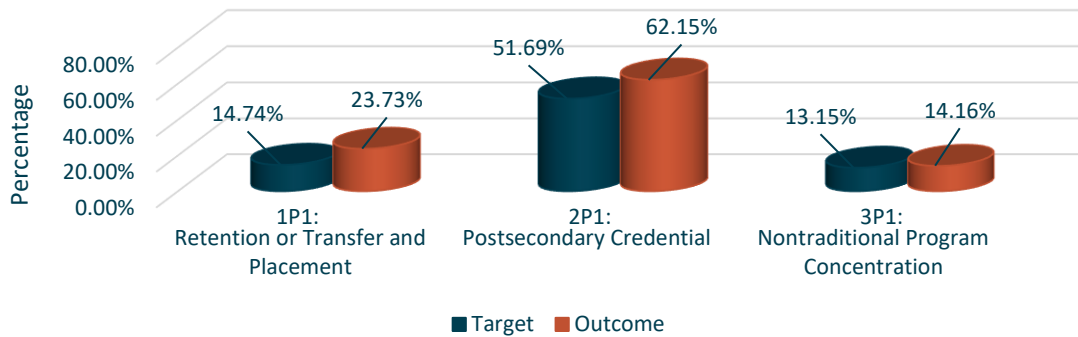

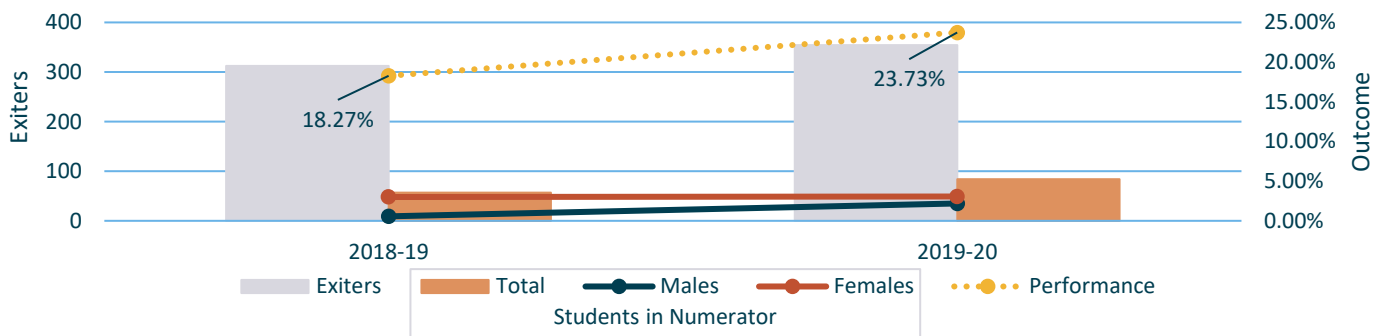

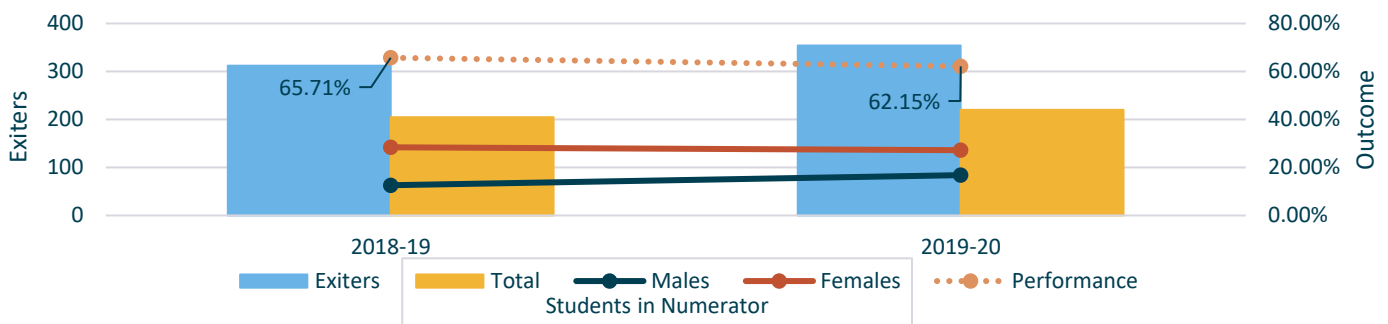
## 2021 Targets and Outcomes



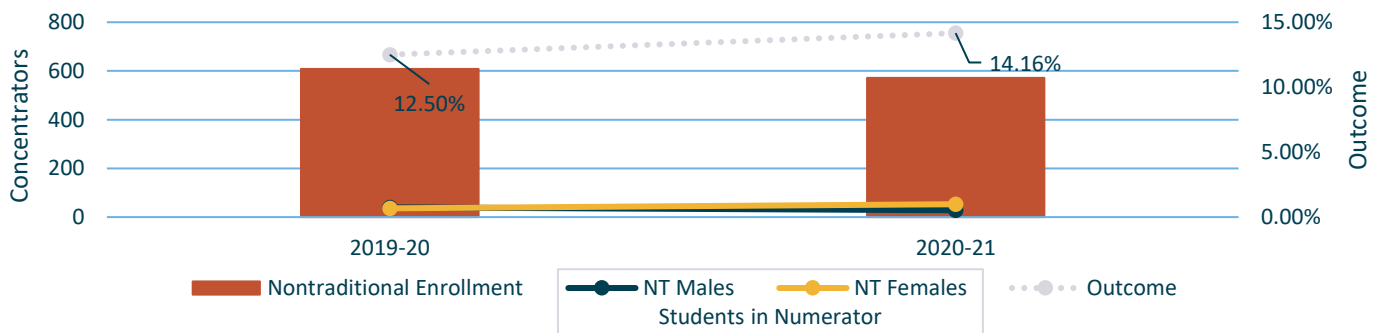
### 1P1: Retention Transfer or Placement



### 2P1: Postsecondary Credential

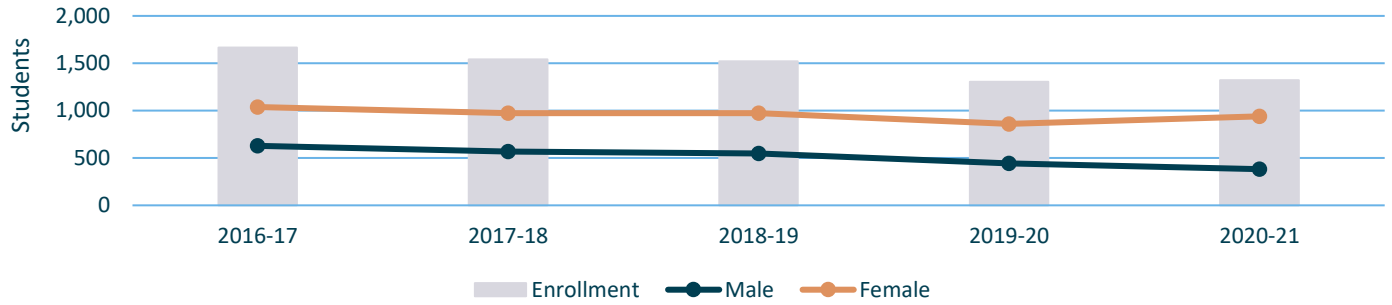


### 3P1: Nontraditional Program Enrollment



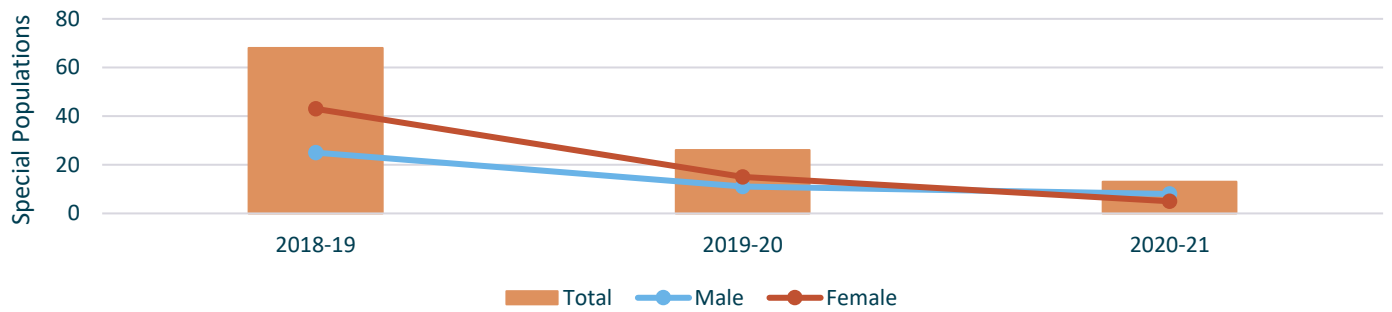
