


Embedding YouTube into Canvas

In this direction sheet you will learn the best practice to embed a YouTube video in Canvas. This will allow Canvas to play the video at ideal size and not link out to YouTube.

1. Click +Add Page within your Canvas module



3. Within the Page Edit function, click on HTML editor to turn on Rich Context Editor

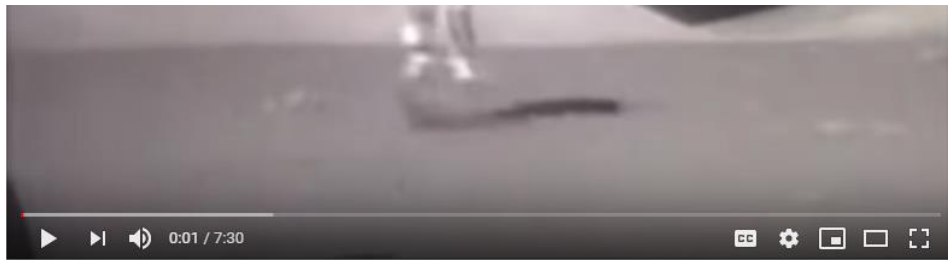

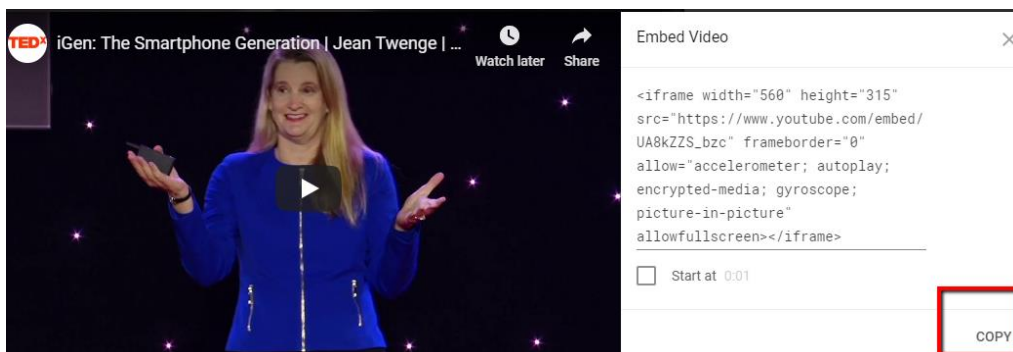
